July 2022 Mission of Mercy Rockford Tops \$1 Million in Free Dental Care Goal After a four-year absence, the Illinois State Dental Society Foundation's Mission of Mercy returns to make a difference in people's lives in Northern Illinois ROCKFORD – The final X-ray machine has left the building. The last drill has made its way back home. But for hundreds of patients in Rockford and the volunteer dental practitioners who helped them for free last weekend, the difference made will be lasting. Over two days of intense care across the sprawling UW Health Sports Factory in Rockford, the Illinois State Dental Society Foundation's Mission of Mercy topped its goal of \$1 million in free dental care provided to more than 1,000 patients in need on July 22-23. The final total of care provided was \$1,024,736.96. Hundreds of dental professionals – dentists, dental hygienists, registered nurses and dental assistants – came together with trucks of equipment and volunteer patient ambassadors to provide free care on a first-come, first-served basis over the two days. Patients are screened and evaluated to determine their needs, then sent to one of several workstations for treatment: everything from cleanings and fillings to extractions and partial dentures. The final procedure count from the Rockford Mission of Mercy event to reach more than \$1 million in care: • Cleanings – 366 • Extractions – 1,159 • Fillings – 916 • X-Rays – 610 • Root Canals – 58 • Partial Dentures -- 54 The ISDS Foundation created the biannual Mission of Mercy in 2010 to provide care for those who otherwise could not afford or access it, with a high priority on patients suffering from dental infection and pain. Patients receiving treatment during the two-day event are taught the importance of good daily oral hygiene practices, healthy diet and routine preventative dental care, and the event serves a strong public reminder of the tremendous needs for critical dental care in the host city and around the region.



The Illinois State Dental Society Foundation will give priority status to 250 U.S. veterans at its next Mission of Mercy scheduled for June 27-29, 2024 at the Peoria Civic Center in Peoria, IL.

In 2024, ILMOM will screen up to 250 veterans beginning at 1:00 pm after the clinic is set-up. These pre-screened veterans will receive priority status upon the clinic opening on Friday.

The Illinois Mission of Mercy (ILMOM) provides free dental care to patients who otherwise do not have the means or access to care. The clinic is set up in a convention center or school and patients are seen on a first-come, first-served basis until capacity is met. There are no criteria or limitations on who may be treated other than they must meet the minimum health standards. It takes 1,000 volunteers to run the clinic. No one is paid for his/her time or talents.

Program Details:

The ILMOM Program Coordinator and Local Arrangements Committee members will communicate with the local Veterans agencies and clubs (County Veterans Assistance Commissions, VFW Posts, and American Legion Posts) to inform them of the Veterans First Program.

The ILMOM Coordinator or members of the ILMOM Local Arrangements Committee will be available to speak with Veterans groups about the Veterans First Program. In addition, printed materials will be distributed to the County Veterans Assistance Commission.

The Illinois State Dental Society Foundation (ISDSF), a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, will host its 7th Mission of Mercy (MOM) event at the Peoria Civic Center in Peoria, Illinois on June 28 & 29, 2024. The event will provide free dental care to over 2,000 children and adults. More than 1,000 dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, lab technicians and general volunteers will donate their time and clinical skills to help patients receive much needed oral health care.

Since 2008, America's Dentists Care Foundation has supported clinics in 31 states, and has provided 290,000 patients with more than \$200 million in charitable oral health care. The Illinois Mission of Mercy event is hosted in different cities across the state of Illinois on a biannual basis. Our 2010 event, held in Bloomington, Illinois, was the most successful inaugural Mission of Mercy event in the United States to date. Our volunteers delivered \$975,000 in dental care to 1,953 patients in just two days. Since then, the Illinois MOM event has been held in Grayslake (2012), Peoria (2014), Collinsville (2016), Springfield (2018), and Rockford (2022). MOM provides free dental care to the uninsured, underinsured and those who are unable to access dental treatment. Anyone who attends without a medically compromising condition that would prohibit them from receiving care is seen on a first-come, first-served basis.



A successful Mission of Mercy accomplishes the following:

Provides access to free dental care while placing a high priority on patients suffering from dental infections or pain.

Raises public awareness of the increasing difficulty low-income adults and children face in accessing critical dental care.

Challenges patients, policy makers and dental professionals to work together to improve the oral health status of the community.

The Illinois State Dental Society Foundation is committed to improving the oral health of children, families and individuals throughout the state. The Mission of Mercy provides access to free dental care while placing a high priority on patients suffering from dental infection and pain. Patients treated during the two-day event are also taught the importance of good daily oral hygiene practices, healthy diet and routine preventive dental care. The Mission of Mercy also raises public awareness of the increasing difficulty low-income adults face in accessing critical dental care. Since 2010, over \$6 million has been donated in professional dental treatment through this charitable event.

The ISDSF administers a Community Grants Program which awards funding annually via a competitive application process. Since 2006, ISDSF has awarded nearly \$585,000 to community organizations, agencies and programs to improve access to dental care and oral health education across the state.

ISDSF believes that education is the foundation of the dental profession. We are dedicated to enhancing the dental profession through special programs and services benefiting Illinois dental students and dentists. The foundation awards scholarships annually. Current D3 students enrolled in the third year of an accredited four-year traditional pre-doctorate dental program in Illinois may apply each year, with scholarship recipients being announced in early July. Student research is also awarded through Table Clinic Awards that recognize basic science/research and clinical/techniques.

The Foundation's Dentists' Support Program is designed to prevent a dentist's career and/or reputation from being destroyed by addiction, and to protect his/her patients from potential harm. This program provides confidential assistance to dentists and their families.

The Relief Program offers confidential emergency or temporary financial assistance to dentists suffering from financial hardship or natural disaster.
